

"A few years ago a staff member left the Scouting profession because, in his words, "he could not see that he or scouting made a difference." He talked about my recently sharing with the staff a story about a young man I had worked with years earlier in my career that came back to see me and to share with me how Scouting had changed his life and given him purpose. This staff member said he could not wait to see the results of his work and he moved on. I felt bad for this staff member. While he went on to a new career that was very much about helping people in immediate need, he could not see that his work truly did make a difference.

A few weeks ago the Hartford Courant ran a story "Scouts Honor: Hartford Men Reunite With Troop Leader Who Saved Them From Gang Culture." Brother Marcus Turcotte met two of his Scouts from Troop 5 sponsored by Immaculate Conception Church in the Frog Hollow neighborhood of south Hartford. The men, now in their 40's, with children of their own, regaled Bro. Marcus with stories about how (Bro. Marcus), their scout leader, saved their lives. From selling drugs on street corners, to leading a life with structure and purpose, Brother Marcus, Scoutmaster of Troop 5, made a difference.

Too often, these stories go untold, for in today's society, we need immediate satisfaction, we need to see results. Scouting is a process of character development, citizenship, and mental and physical preparedness. It does not just happen overnight, it happens because of leaders like Brother Marcus, and donors like you.
